

Constitution of Red Army Loud and Proud

1. Name.

The name of the Group shall be Red Army Loud and Proud.

2. Objects.

The Group is established for non-profit making objects and purposes only.

The purposes of the Group relate to activities as Swindon Town Football Club supporters and shall be:

- To be the 12th man at every match
- To introduce more club colours into the match day experience
- To continuously grow its membership meaning more people taking part
- To have fun on match days - home and away
- To hold various events at selected matches throughout the season
- To purchase match day items to add to the visual aspect of the atmosphere
- To be loud and proud
- To become recognised around the country as one of the best sets of fans

3. Powers.

In order to achieve its aims the Group may:

- a. Raise money
- b. Open bank accounts
- c. Take out insurance
- d. Organise events
- e. Work with similar Groups and exchange information and advice with them
- f. Do anything that is lawful which will help it to fulfil its objects.

4. Membership.

- a. Membership of the Group shall be open to any individual over eighteen without regards to disability, political or religious affiliation, race, sex or sexual orientation who is:
 - i. Interested in helping the Group to achieve its objects
 - ii. Willing to abide by the rules of the Group
- b. The membership of any member may be terminated for good reason by the Management Committee: Provided that the member concerned shall have the right to be heard by the Management Committee, accompanied by a friend, before a final decision is made.

5. Management.

- a. A Management Committee of not less than three and not more than nine individuals elected at the Group's Annual General Meeting (A.G.M.) shall administer the Group.
- b. The Officers of the Management Committee shall be: the Chairman/woman (hereinafter "the Chairman"), the Treasurer and the Secretary.
- c. The Management Committee may co-opt onto the Committee, up to three individuals, in an advisory and non-voting capacity that it feels will help to fulfil the aim of the Group.
- d. The Management Committee shall meet at least two times a year.
- e. At least three Management Committee members must be present for a Management Committee meeting to take place.
- f. Voting at Management Committee meetings shall be by a show of hands. If there is a tied vote then the Chairperson shall have a second vote.

- g. The Management Committee shall have the power to remove any member of the Committee for good and proper reason.
- h. The Management Committee may appoint any other member of the Group as a Committee member to fill a vacancy, provided that the maximum prescribed is not exceeded.

6. The Duties of the Officers.

- a. The duties of the Chairman shall be to:
 - i. Chair meetings of the Committee and the Group
 - ii. Represent the Group at functions/meetings that the Group has been invited to and
 - iii. Act as the spokesperson of the Group when necessary.
- b. The duties of the Secretary shall be to:
 - i. Keep a membership list
 - ii. Prepare in consultation with the Chairman the agenda for meetings of the Committee and the Group
 - iii. Take and keep minutes of all meetings and
 - iv. Collect and circulate any relevant information within the Group.
- c. The duties of the Treasurer shall be to:
 - i. Supervise the financial affairs of the Group and
 - ii. Keep proper accounts that show all monies received and paid out by the Group.

7. Finance.

- a. All monies received by or on behalf of the Group shall be applied to further the objects of the Group and for no other purpose.
- b. Any bank accounts opened for the Group shall be in the name of the Group.
- c. The Treasurer shall sign any cheques issued and by two other nominated members of the Management Committee.
- d. The Group shall ensure that its accounts are audited or independently examined every year.
- e. The Group may pay reasonable out of pocket expenses including travel, childcare and meal costs to members or Management Committee members, incurred as part of their duties on behalf of the Group, if agreed in advance by the Management Committee.

8. Annual General Meeting.

- a. The Group shall hold an Annual General Meeting (A.G.M.) in the month of May.
- b. All members shall be given at least fourteen days notice of the A.G.M. and shall be entitled to attend and vote.
- c. The business of the A.G.M. shall include:
 - i. Receiving a report from the Chairman on the Group's activities over the year
 - ii. Receiving a report from the Treasurer on the finances of the Group
 - iii. Electing a new Management Committee
 - iv. Considering any other matter as may be decided
 - v. At least five members must be present for the Annual General Meeting and any other General Meeting to take place.

9. General Meetings.

- a. There shall be at least one General Meeting (excluding the A.G.M) each year.
- b. All members shall be entitled to attend and vote.

10. Special General Meeting.

A Special General Meeting may be called by the Management Committee or five members to discuss an urgent matter. The Secretary shall give all members fourteen

days notice of any Special General Meeting together with notice of the business to be discussed.

11. Alterations to the Constitution.

Any changes to this Constitution must be agreed by at least two-thirds of those members present and voting at any General Meeting.

12. Dissolution.

The Group may be wound up at any time if agreed by two-thirds of those members present and voting at any General Meeting. In the event of winding up any assets remaining after all debts have been paid shall be given to another Group with a similar aim.

13. Adoption of the Constitution.

Until the first A.G.M. takes place the persons whose names, addresses and signatures appear at the bottom of this document shall act as the Management Committee referred to in this constitution.
